Criminal record check

Distance learning

This means that you are studying by correspondence. You may already be working in aged care and want to improve your skills. Or, you may be considering a move into this fast-growing, rewarding sector.

Workplace based

This means that you are a trainee, or enrolled with a group of others at your workplace, or undertaking Recognition of Prior Learning. Fees for workplace based training are negotiated with you and/or your employer.

Learning materials provided

There are 14 units (subjects) in this course: 10 Compulsory and 4 Elective units. A comprehensive learner guide is provided for each unit.

Assessment requirements

Each unit has a range of activities, questions and projects to be completed. Plus, you will be required to do workplace based assessment.

Workplace based assessment

Workplace training gives students the opportunity to develop practical job skills, such as interacting with people in a professional environment, developing communication skills, as well as an insight into particular job roles and responsibilities. Workplace training is a mandatory part of this course.

You'll need to undertake a total of 100 hours in residential aged care.

When you enrol, you will be provided with guidelines for organising your placement, forms to be completed to inform us of your workplace arrangements, and information for your workplace supervisor.
